Potential Aquatics Complex





The McFarland Recreation and Park District opened the original aquatics center in June 1982. It served the community for 40 years. It is made of aluminum and magnesium.



Each year, the pool was drained in August (for all 40+ years).



We were getting the pool ready for swim season when COVID-19 closed everything down. Due to this, the pool was empty for three years.



2'-4' ridges developed that will not go down making the pool unsafe for use.



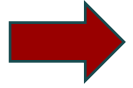
MRPD hired Counselman-Hunsaker, a nationally recognized pool company, to determine our course of action.

➔ Counselman-Hunsaker determined the pool could not be fixed for less than \$1,000,000 with only a five-year lifespan.

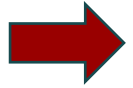
➔ They gave us another option of an all-new facility for \$10,000,000. This would last between 30-40 years.



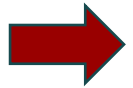
➔ The MRPD Board of Directors decided this is an investment in the community we should present to the voters.



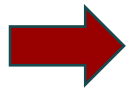
The Board hired Isom Advisors to assist with bond measure.



The Bond Measure will appear as letter 'S' on your ballot.



Cost equals \$22.84 per year per \$100,000 value of property. Property owners would pay \$68.52 per year for a \$300,000 home.



It is a 30-year bond measure.



If funds remain after the aquatics complex, MRPD has a prioritized list of projects in its' strategic plan it will work on. The first on the list, after the aquatics complex, is to add HVAC and solar to the community gymnasium.

Community support has been amazing so far. We are looking for registered voters to serve on our campaign and oversight committees.
